We welcome you today

We would like to remind our visitors of the following;:

- All people are encouraged to participate in the sacred services of our Church. We hope that you will be able to worship as well as have fellowship with us. Should you wish any information about the Orthodox Faith or this parish in particular, please see the rector or any member of the church. We are able to place you on our mailing list.
- Only Orthodox Christians may receive the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in the Orthodox Church. In like manner, Orthodox Christians may not receive the sacraments in an non-Orthodox Church. While we hope that one day all Christians will find unity and be able to approach the chalice of our Lord together, we observe the teachings of the Church that the Eucharist is a gift of unity and not a means of unity.

We remind our faithful and visitors of the following guidelines concerning the Holy Sacraments in the Orthodox Church.

- Orthodox Christians are urged to receive Holy Communion frequently.
- ❖ Communicants should be at peace with others before approaching the chalice(Mt 5:23-24)
- Realize the importance of making a thorough examination of sins and transgressions against God, ourselves and others and having prayed for forgiveness before coming to Holy Communion.
- Frequent communicants should come to Holy Confession at least four times a year (during the four fasting periods of the year). and additionally when an examination of conscience reveals the necessity to do so in order to heal any sinful behavior.
- Communicants should fast from all foods and liquids from the evening before receiving Holy Communion.
- Communicants should read prayers in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.
- All Orthodox Christians must receive the sacraments at least once a year.
- Those who are late for Divine Liturgy (after the reading of the Epistle and Gospel) should not approach the chalice.
- Those who are ill or who have special physical needs are exempt from the above guidelines.
- Infants and children (up to the age of seven) who are Orthodox Christians may receive Holy Communion and are exempt from the above guidelines.

Thank you for gathering to worship with us today. Together we have glorified the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we be brought closer to one another and closer to God by following the eternal teachings of our Lord.

ми спонукаємо православних християн часто ходити до Святого Причастя;

ті, хто причащаються, повинні бути у мирі з іншими перш, нас підійти до євхаристичної чаші (Св.Матвій 5:23-24); **перед** тим, як прийти на Святе Причастя, дуже важливо ретельно осмислити гріхи і порушення, які було вчинено проти Бога, нас самих та інших і помолитися за їх відпущення;

тим, хто часто причащається, слід приходити на святу сповідь принаймні чотири рази на рік (під час кожного із чотирьох щорічних постів);

ті, хто причащається, повинні з вечора перед прийняттям Святого Причастя, припинити вживання всякої їжі і напоїв; **ті,** хто причащається, повинні шляхом молитов підготувати себе до прийняття причастя;

всі православні християни повинні, принаймні, раз на рік отримати Святе Причастя;

ті, хто спізнився на Божественну Літургію (прийшов після того, як було прочитано Апостол і Євангеліє) не можуть підходити до чаші; **хворі**, і ті, хто має обмезсені фізичні моеисливості, звільняються від вище викладених вимог; **немовлята** та діти до семи років, які належать до Православної християнської віри, можуть отримувати Святе Причастя і звільняються від вшиє викладених вимог;


THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO SAINT MATTHEM

\$700 for the Orthodox Mission in Guatemala.




Over the past 30 years our parish, under the sponsorship of the Orthodox Clergy Brotherhood of Greater Pittsburgh, has participated in the Walk for Missions. Through this outreach, we've been blessed to support some historic developments in spreading the Good News in many parts of the world. Ours was the first parish to sponsor 5 young men from Indonesia at the Holy Cross Seminary, four of whom are now serving as missionaries in their native land. We also sent and sponsored OCMC mission teams and missionaries to Africa, Upper Galilee, Project Mexico, Russia, Albania, India and more recently to Guatemala. With the help of funds from these walks, medical clinics, churches, fish ponds, seminaries and schools have been constructed. Even our Philoptochos sent teams to the Hogar Rafael Orphanage to support the work of the nuns. Now in our 30th year, we have begun a major project in the Highlands of Guatemala- a Seminary/Mission Center that will train catechists and seminarians to serve their own people in 130 villages throughout Guatemala and Southern Mexico. This project has the blessing of Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, Archbishop Athenagoras of Mexico and the OCMC, representing all the canonical bishops of America. God willing, and with your support, we hope to consecrate the new building in January. This will be the spiritual, educational and administrative center of the Orthodox Church for all of Guatemala, mainly serving the needs of the Mayan people. The two-story building will feature dormitories, classrooms, lecture halls, kitchen, administrative offices and a cafeteria. Hundreds of volunteers from all the villages donate their labor, and we provide the materials needed for construction. This facility, once completed, will be a light on the hill for thousands of people who seek to embrace our faith. In fulfillment of Christ's commission to make disciples of all nations, our Walk for Missions, true to its 30-year tradition, will direct all funds towards this project. We encourage you to join us on October 8th, either as walkers or sponsors for the walk in South Park. (Fr. John Chakos)






